**100TH ANNIVERSARY
GRAND NEST CONVENTION
JULY 26-29, 2006 MILWAUKEE, WI**

The 100th Centennial convention site was the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Milwaukee, WI. This was the same hotel that hosted the 75th celebration.

Wednesday, July 26

The attendees were welcomed to a cocktail hour in the open atrium of the hotel. A “Taste of Milwaukee” buffet allowed everyone to get re-acquainted while listening to an award winning jazz quartet. The attendees were then lured back out to the atrium for dessert.

Then the lights dimmed and an audio-visual presentation took place celebrating our 100 year journey as an organization of Character, Charity, and Fellowship. The sensory experience of music, lights, confetti streamers, and cannons was amazing. Commemorative DVD’s were produced for a historical memento.

Thursday, July 27

The opening ceremonies were preceded by a buffet in the atrium. Our members were greeted by the Germanfest festival participants. The D’Oberlander Bavarian Folk Dancers provided a “Taste” of our Milwaukee lakefront German ethnic festival that was being celebrated this weekend.

Jean Rex on the accordion and Doug Scott on the Flugel horn accompanied the dancers and then led our members in the national anthems of Australia, Canada and the United States. The colors were presented by the City of

Milwaukee Police Department Color Guard.

Reverend Douglas J. Leonhardt, S.J. of Marquette University provided the invocation.

Special presentations were made to our Order. First, Governor Jim Doyle represented by Deputy Insurance Commissioner Claire Stapleton Concord, Australian Native, proclaimed this week Blue Goose International week in the State of Wisconsin. Next, State Representative Jeff Stone presented a citation from the Wisconsin Legislative recognizing our organization.

Following those presentations the Mayor of the City of Milwaukee, Tom Barrett, welcomed us to Milwaukee and proclaimed these convention days, the Honorable Order of the Blue Goose Days in Milwaukee.

Also, the Milwaukee County Executive, Scott Walker, sent us a proclamation acknowledging Blue Goose Day in the County of Milwaukee! Joseph Pause, the Mayor of Green Lake, WI sent us a proclamation recognizing our return to the “banks” of Green Lake, WI for our special birthday celebration.

MLGG Seider in the tradition of Charity made a special presentation to the Special Olympics of Wisconsin. GWGQ Maloney then presented on behalf of the membership a check for \$12,000 to our fellow Ganders of the Louisiana Pond who were

devastated by the hurricane Katrina. MLG Jon Masanz and WGQ Fred Combs accepted on behalf of their fellow Ganders.

The Greater Chicago Pond presented a dignified Memorial Service honoring those who passed away this past year.

The Michigan Pond then provided an outstanding reenactment of the original initiation ceremony using “Turn of the Century” costumes. The precision and memorization of the ritual was outstanding and certainly one of the many Centennial highlights that bombarded the attendees throughout their very special benchmark in our Order’s history.

Thursday evening’s theme was the “Streets of Old Milwaukee in 1906”. The Milwaukee Museum was the setting. Throughout the “Streets” that were recreated to take your back to the turn of the century were buffet food stations serving the ethnic dishes of the times.

Friday, July 28

MLGG Seider called the session to order. He called upon GN Historian Snyder, JA Ross and GWGQ Maloney to provide their reports to the membership. These were followed by the presentation of awards to the Ponds that have achieved success in membership.

The rest of the day was open for the attendees to take part in Germanfest, brewery boat tours, Milwaukee Brewers baseball, and many other venues.

Saturday July 29th

After breakfast the Virginia Pond presented a video on Williamsburg, VA and celebration of their 400th year celebration and the Virginia Pond's 100th year celebration. The next order of business was the election of our new slate of officers for 2006-2007. Our newest MLGG is Keith Strohecker of the Virginia Pond and our incoming GKGGE was Joe Coccia of the Michigan Pond.

As the evening drew closer the anticipation of the 100th Gala Ball celebration was building. The atrium was colorfully decorated with blue and white balloons. A perfect setting for the cocktail hour. The ballroom itself was kept a secret until the last minute. Then all were invited to enjoy the special menu.

But first things first, the PMLGG's in attendance and the Grand Nest officers were introduced as usual. However, normal was the last thing on everyone's mind when the University of Wisconsin marching band came parading in right behind PMLGG Seider and GWGQ Maloney and their wives. The band was playing a stand up and clap your hands rousing rendition of "On Wisconsin", (excuse me) "On You Goslings" just as was played 100 years ago in Green Lake, WI by our founding fathers. The "fifth quarter", which is the bands celebration after every football game was front and center. The attendees really had a "ball" like no other.

The Hyatt hotel's quality of service, attention and food was

outstanding all week only to be culminated by serving our surprise dessert consisting of 8 inch chocolate goose, filled with chocolate mousse and fresh berries. An elegant touch to an outstanding dinner.

Once again, before anyone could enjoy their special dessert, all stood up to sing a rousing rendition of Happy Birthday Blue Goose while we rolled out a uniquely built 3 tier birthday cake. The real surprise was "Cliffie the Goose" who came back out of the archives to grace us with his presence just as he did for almost 25 years when one of our most dedicated Blue Goose members, PMLGG Cliff Needham would bring him to our Balls to add in the festivities. "Cliffie" had everyone on the dance floor doing the famous Goose dance (chicken dance).

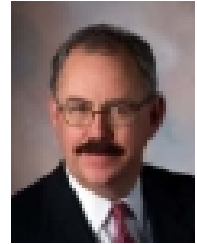
